### **Catholic Life**

With October flying by it might be timely to remind ourselves that this is the month that is dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary. Pope Francis has said that praying the rosary is "good for the heart, good for the soul, good for your whole life" Please take time each day to say some of the prayers of the Rosary - Glory Be, Our Father and Hail Mary. That prayer has been one of the distinctive parts of Catholic devotion for centuries. The calm, unhurried repetitions of the prayers help us to focus on the mysteries that the Rosary celebrates. That repetition creates a space for us to picture and ponder the life, death and resurrection of Christ and of Mary's part in that story of our salvation. Miss Foster will be leading the rosary group each Friday in the school library at lunchtime – please encourage your child to bring in Rosary beads to school which they can use to pray. Our wonderful Liturgy group led us in Mass this week, it was beautiful and the children were reverent in their behaviour.

Harvest time is a time for us to come together to give thanks for God's abundant gifts and to help those in need in our local parish community. Thank you to those who have already donated food items for the B30 foodbank. Please continue to show your support next week, by donating tinned, dried, long life food supplies.

### **Communication**

Staff, are available at the end of the school day if you need to see them. Please be mindful of the process of communicating with staff: 1<sup>st</sup> port of call should always be your child's Class teacher followed by the Phase Leader (KS2 Mrs Barton, KS1 Mrs Ingram, EYFS Miss Foster). If you still have concerns following this line of communication please see the Vice Principal (Mrs Williams) in the first instance followed by the Principal (Mrs Damms). A member of staff is present at the door each morning to take any messages from parents. Whilst senior leaders are also at the front office each morning, if you need to see any of us about an issue, please pop into the school office to make an appointment. We would rather not discuss important matters that require our individual attention whilst welcoming children into school. We would also like to give you the time you deserve. Thank you for your co-operation. Have you given the school office your e-mail address yet? If not please do as a matter of urgency. Remember we are on a quest to becoming a paperless school and will be e-mailing out the newsletter and other correspondences as of week beginning 5<sup>th</sup> November.



### Parent Pay

By now our online method of paying should be well used and established. Can I please remind you all dinners, toast, breakfast club and afterschool club must be paid for in advance. We cannot get into a situation whereby the office staff are having to chase late payments. Thank you for your continued support in ensuring all payments are up to date.

### Medical updates

Please ensure that if your child is asthmatic that they have their blue/brown inhaler on their person at all times. It is the parents responsibility to ensure that they are full and in date. School do not keep spare inhalers. If you feel that your child no longer needs their inhaler we will need to see written confirmation from their GP stating so otherwise we will expect your child to carry their own inhaler. If you have a spare inhaler for your child their class teacher will be happy to store it in the classroom.

### Attendance Figures

Our attendance this week was 95%. The class with the highest attendance was Y3 with 98% Well Done! Our class with the lowest attendance was 92% which is well below or school target. Please ensure children are in school every day and appointments are made out of school time.



### Breakfast Club

It has been great to see so many children attending breakfast club each morning. Please remember that **breakfast club does not start until 7:45am**. Children cannot be dropped off at school before this time as there is no capacity for children to be supervised before this

time. We have had a number of pupils dropped off much earlier than 7:45am which is a safeguarding concern for us as a school. Please ensure pupils are dropped off no earlier than 7:45am. Breakfast club costs £1.50 per day and needs to be paid weekly via Parent Pay.
