This raffle is held every week and was won this week by:

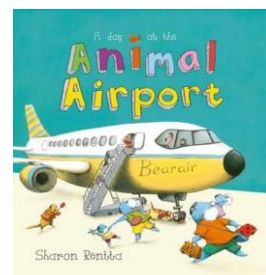
